

# **Our Mission:**

We create pathways for individuals to discover their strengths and take control of their futures.

We envision a world where everyone, regardless of background, has access to quality education, equitable opportunities, and the tools to reach their full potential. We are committed to building a society where diversity is celebrated, individuals are empowered, and every voice is heard and respected.

# **From Humble Beginnings**

In its early years, Phyllis Wheatley was a safe place for young African American women to board while attending the University of Minnesota during a time when segregation prevented them from rooming on campus. The agency quickly became the center of the African American social scene, and it evolved into a home-away-from-home for numerous African American civic leaders, educators, entertainers, and students. The Wheatley, as it was affectionately called, was the only place in Minneapolis where non-whites were permitted to lodge during the time of Jim Crow laws, which codified discrimination and segregation.

Today, Phyllis Wheatley programs address the needs of children, youth, families, and elders by providing tailored education and skill-building opportunities to help individuals and families discover their strengths, develop their personal networks of support, and take control of their futures.
